### BELCZAK'S BULLETIN

There is a story about a man in his home as flood waters began to rise. As he looked out his first-floor window, he saw a man riding by in his boat. The man shouted, "Get in the boat and save your life!" "No," the man replied. "I'm going to pray and trust in the Lord!"

The floodwaters kept rising and soon the poor fellow was looking out the second-floor window. Again a man in a boat rode by and implored him to get into the boat and save his life. "No!" came the firm reply. "I'm praying and trusting in the Lord!"

The water continued to rise and soon the man was forced to the highest peak of his rooftop. A helicopter flew by and hovered over his head. The pilot said over the loudspeaker, "We're going to drop a rope ladder. Climb into the helicopter and save your life!" Once more the stranded man, perched high upon the rooftop, replied, "No! I'm going to pray and trust in the Lord!"

As you might expect, the poor man drowned. When he got to the pearly gates, he complained, "I trusted in you, Lord, and I prayed. Why did you let me down?" "I don't know what more I could have done," said God. I sent you two boats and a helicopter!"

All great things come from a combination of God's help and our toil. All wonderful happenings are a result of a working relationship between God and us. God provides the seed, but it's up to us to make something of the seed. If we want God to give us a blessing (like saving us from a rising flood), we have to take advantage of the resources God has already provided.

Today's gospel lays it on the line with the verse: "Much will be required of a person entrusted with much." If we want God to give us the world, we have to be willing to pay for it. We cannot be the one to whom much is given without being the one of whom much is expected.



**Thursday, August 15 is the Feast of the Assumption of Mary – a Holy Day. Mass will be celebrated at 9:00 in the morning and again at 7:00 in the evening.**

We celebrate Our Blessed Mother's Assumption into heaven each year on August 15<sup>th</sup>. Mary is the first of those redeemed by her Son, who came wholly into God's presence. From the earliest church documents, we read of the dormition, which is the falling asleep or death of Mary. Documents dating from the fifth century indicate that the Church in the East celebrated the Feast of the Dormition of Mary.

The celebration of her Assumption expressed our faith in the saving power of the resurrection of Christ. Celebrations of Mary are at their root celebrations of Christ. He is "the first fruits and then, at his coming, all who belong to him." This is how St. Paul recalls the raising from the dead all that have fallen asleep in Christ. This verse is from the second reading of this feast day. The church has long known that if anyone belonged to Jesus, it was Mary. Although in the natural order of things, Jesus belongs to Mary – he was her child. That is the focal point of the gospel reading on Friday.

Bright and early in the morning we might imagine Mary is up and off to see her cousin Elizabeth. This rare down-home story is peculiar to Luke, and we are glad to have it. It is by the gift of the Holy Spirit that Elizabeth recognized that the pregnant Mary was to be the mother of "my Lord."

Mary's response to Elizabeth's faith is her prayer called the *Magnificat*, a title we get from the first word of the Latin translation of these verses. Although it is a beautiful prayer, the *Magnificat* it is not an original but a combination of several Old Testament passages, similar to the prayer Hannah said when she dedicated her only son, Samuel, to God's service. (1 Samuel 2)

God's preference for the poor and the lowly over the rich and powerful is a theme running throughout the prayer. God confuses the proud and deposes mighty kings, but he looks kindly upon those who are weak and insignificant, raising them to places of honor and giving them their fill of good things.

The *Magnificat* provides an excellent description of how God has acted throughout history. God constantly chose to work through the least likely candidates. He uses Abraham's old and barren wife, Sarah, instead of a young and fertile maidservant to fulfill his promise that Abraham would become the father of a great nation. He sent Moses, a man with a speech impediment,

to demand that pharaoh allow the Jews to leave Egypt. God took David, a poor shepherd boy, and made him the greatest king.

Mary appropriately rejoices in how God enjoys working through ordinary people because she too was poor and lowly. A young girl in her early teens from the small town of Nazareth in unsophisticated Galilee would not dare dream that God would have special plans for her. But God did, and Mary responded affirmatively to God's power in her life.

Mary did something that many women before and after her did. She gave birth to a child. This birth was special not only because her child was the Son of God but also because she said "yes" to God's will in her life. Pray today that each of us will have the courage and the faith to say "yes" to whatever God wants of us. Ask Mary to pray that you can become more like her, always open to God's power and spirit in your life.

**Join us on Monday as we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption. We will celebrate Mass at 9:00 in the morning and 7:00 in the evening on Thursday, August 15<sup>th</sup>.**

Use this prayer, the *Regina Caeli*, before going to bed each evening this week:

*Queen of heaven, rejoice, alleluia!*

The son whom you merited to bear, alleluia!

Has risen as he said, alleluia!

*Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia!*

*For the Lord is truly risen, alleluia!*

# Stewardship Matters

## Faith and Finances

For some of us, faith and finances don't mix. Our faith and deep-rooted views on spirituality and religion are personal journeys signifying our relationship with God our Creator. This faith encourages us to pray, attend Mass, help those in need, and can encourage us to become better people overall.

Finances, on the other hand, are simply considered our paychecks; how we pay our bills and journey through this life. We think of banking, savings, and paying our taxes as something entirely different from our faith lives. After all, God doesn't care about our finances. Or does he?

According to the recent study, *Unleashing Catholic Generosity: Explaining the Catholic Giving Gap in the United States*, the University of Notre Dame Institute for Church Life discovered that separating faith and finances is the single most important factor explaining why Catholics give less than other denominations.

For some, our lack of spiritual engagement with money causes us to compartmentalize and not see our money and possessions as part of our spiritual lives. As stewards, we know this is a mistake. We know that God is responsible for all of our gifts, including money, and that because of His generosity we are called to return a portion of those gifts. Viewing finances from a spiritual perspective allows us to give more generously and as stewards we know that is the only way to give.
