## FIRST SUNDAY FOOD DRIVE DELIVERY

The first weekend of each month St. Kenneth collects large quantities of non-perishable food, soap, and paper products to be used by outreach centers in Detroit. On Monday or Tuesday following the food drive weekend (immediately after the 9:00 AM Mass) parishioners help load the donated articles into vehicles for delivery. **Time Commitment:** 1-2 hours

## GLEANERS FOOD BANK

The Gleaners Food Bank turns surplus food into millions of meals every year for Southeast Michigan's hungry. St. Kenneth volunteers meet at church and car pool to one of their warehouses on a Saturday morning to assist in this effort. Minor volunteers (17 and under) require adult supervision.

**Time Commitment:** approximately 5 hours.

## BLOOD DRIVE

Each Tuesday after the 9:00 AM Mass the Blessed Sacrament is placed in the monstrance upon the altar. In an effort to be sure that one or two persons are always present with the Blessed Sacrament we would like to schedule some attendees at specific times.

### USHER

Ministers of Hospitality, including ushers, greet and assist parishioners and guests as they enter the church for worship, and throughout the services. Ushers also assist with the gift procession during the liturgy, and distribute bulletins at the conclusion of mass.

**Time Commitment:** Ushers can sign up to serve regularly at any of the Masses celebrated. Captains are assigned to assist with scheduling and coverage. One general meeting is held per year.

## GREETER

By welcoming visitors and sharing conversation, Greeters assist in helping visitors feel comfortable in the St. Kenneth family.

**Time Commitment:** 30 minutes prior to and after Sunday liturgy on a rotating basis. All are welcome to join this ministry.

## LECTOR

Lectors study, reflect upon and proclaim God's Word at assigned Holyday and weekend Masses throughout the year. Lectors are provided with study guides and are scheduled well in advance. Currently, all lectors are expected to attend an annual meeting for the purposes of formation in ministry.

**Time Commitment:** The number of Saturdays or Sundays a lector is assigned will vary with the total number of available lectors. One 90 -minute meeting is held annually for formation and instruction.

## SACRISTAN

Clean and purify the vessels used during Mass and set up for the following Mass if required. Assist visiting clergy as necessary in preparing for the liturgy. Serve at the weekend liturgy of your choice.

**Time Commitment:** 15 minutes before and after Mass as needed on each weekend assigned.

## SACRISTY LINEN CLEANING

Wash and press as required linen (purificators, towels, and other linens) used during Mass. Pick up linen in the Sacristy on Monday and return on Tuesday.

**Time Commitment:** Once every 2-3 months

## WEDDING COORDINATOR

Wedding Coordinators (typically assigned in two-person teams) assist the bride, groom and their families through the rehearsal process, usually the night before the wedding. They work with the Pastor and the Coordinator of Liturgical Ministries to ensure that wedding celebrations occur with minimal confusion. The Coordinators also work the day of the wedding.

**Time Commitment:** Frequency of assigned dates varies with the number of weddings held. One or two 1-hour meetings are held per season for formation in ministry.

Eucharistic ministers are certified lay ministers who assist in distribution of the Body and Blood of Christ during the Eucharistic celebrations in church. **Time Commitment:** Sunday Masses as needed.

Eucharistic ministers are certified lay ministers who assist in the distribution of the Body of Christ to the sick, elderly and shut-ins of the community. **Time Commitment:** Visitation to the sick, elderly and shut-ins varies from location to location, generally not more than 1-2 hours per week.

## CANTORS/SINGERS

Cantors/singers assist at Mass by leading the songs, as well as other litanies and responses. Cantors also lead the assembly in singing hymns and songs during Mass. Cantors should be able to read music and sing harmony parts.

**Time Commitment:** A minimum of 2 masses per month. Occasional Thursday evening rehearsals. Arrive 30 minutes prior to Mass.

## EASTER BELL CHOIR

The Bell Choir assists with the music during Mass. No previous experience is required. All ages are welcome. The ability to read music is helpful, but not necessary. The Bell Choir plays at the Easter Vigil. We will have tutorial workshop at the first rehearsal to learn the proper way to ring the bells. **Time Commitment:** Thursday nights during Lent. Play at the Easter Vigil Mass.

## SEASONAL CHOIR

The Seasonal Choir sings during Advent and Christmas Masses and resumes for Lent and Easter masses. No experience is necessary. All ages and levels are welcome. The ability to read music is helpful, but not necessary.

**Time Commitment:**

**Christmas Choir** - Once a week in November and December

**Easter Choir** - Once a week during Lent

## WORSHIP MUSICIANS

Worship Musicians provide musical support for the Cantors and assembly. You must be able to read music. All instrumentalists are welcome. No prior ensemble experience is necessary, but previous private study is required if you haven't played with an ensemble. **Time Commitment:** A minimum of 2 masses per month. Occasional Thursday evening rehearsals. Arrive 30 minutes prior to Mass.

## YOUTH CHOIR & HANDBELLS

**Time Commitment:** September thru December and/or January thru April. Rehearsals Thursday evening 6:30 PM to 7:15 PM.

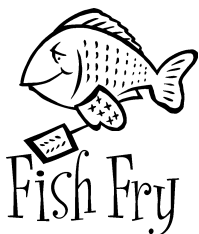


## STEWARDSHIP

### EDUCATION COMMISSION MEMBER

The Education Commission member participates in the planning of events or programs whose goal is to promote faith growth for all members of the parish **Time Commitment:** Monthly meeting September thru May. Participation/leadership in some of the sponsored events.

### CATECHIST

The parish catechist shares faith, leading children and youth to greater knowledge and discipleship, using prepared materials. Training and resources are provided. **Time Commitment:** Prepares for and meets weekly with small groups of children grades 1 thru 5, on Monday or Tuesday from 4:45 PM to 6:15 PM. September thru May.

### CATECHIST ASSISTANT

Works with CFP Catechist on regular or as needed basis, offering assistance with small group. **Time Commitment:** During CFP session regularly.

### CATECHIST SUBSTITUTE

Called upon to take a catechist's place as needed in CFP. Lesson plan and materials are provided. **Time Commitment:** 1 hour 15 minutes session, as needed, depending on your availability.

### HALL MONITOR

Adult presence in the hallway to monitor children needing to be out of the classroom during class time. **Time Commitment:** 1 hour 15 minutes.

### NURSERY AIDE - CFP

This ministry is available during CFP providing child care for the catechist's children during the session. **Time Commitment:** 1 hour 15 minutes during the actual session.

### RAINBOW SUNDAY (Preschool)

Rainbow Sunday Team members plan the Sunday Children's Liturgy of the Word using provided materials. **Time Commitment:** Plan and preside during the 9:00 AM or 11:00 AM Sunday Mass, approximately once every three weeks; September thru April.

### LOGOS (Grades 6)

Catechists pass on our faith to the youth through developed lessons and their own creative inspiration. They will be given a teacher's manual to work from and adapt. Catechists are required to work toward completing some Basic Certification Topics. **Time commitment:** 1 hour, 2 sessions per month, Thursdays 7:00-8:00 p.m.

### LOGOS - MEAL TEAM

The Meal Team performs two different jobs as a team:

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is the process whereby those who are un-baptized or those baptized wishing to become Catholic Christians come together to pray, study and enrich their faith and belief in Jesus. They meet formally as a group with us for nine months, until the Easter Vigil at which time they celebrate the sacraments of initiation, Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Sponsors walk with the RCIA candidates through the process from September thru May. They must be fully initiated and active members of St. Kenneth. **Time Commitment:** Time varies, September thru May.
